EMPOWERING YOUTH THROUGH INSPIRATION AND ADVENTURE

In the summer of 2022, seven young writers, ages 14-16, took to the woods and waters of western Maine to deepen their craft by exploring their writing — and the wilderness — in a new way.

The seven-day canoeing and rock climbing course, part of a partnership between HIOBS and The Telling Room, was specifically designed to provide these young writers with team and leadership

development skills, traditional Outward Bound-based expeditionary skills, and the opportunity to get to know fellow writers and peers.

The heart of the Outward Bound experience is learning by doing. Groups are placed in an unfamiliar environment, with the necessary tools for solving problems, and then challenged with a goal that requires group cooperation and teamwork. This experience gives students the chance to expand their communication, problem-solving, and leadership skills in an exciting outdoor environment.

What these students found is that whether searching for the right word or perfect phrase, a handhold, or the next cairn, every journey on the page and the trail begins with the same deliberate intention: the willingness to strike out on an adventure and walk into the unknown. Accompanied by a Telling Room Teaching Artist and HIOBS course instructors, these writers found connection, challenge, and growth within their writing and in the wide world around them.

As a literary arts education organization focused on young writers ages 6 to 18, The Telling Room seeks to build confidence, strengthen literacy skills, and provide real audiences for its students. The Telling Room believes that the power of creative expression can change communities and prepare youth for success both now and in the future.

Our Scholarship Program is guided by a single principle: every person, regardless of means, should have the opportunity to discover more within themselves through the challenge and adventure of an Outward Bound course.

We firmly believe in equal opportunities for everyone, regardless of their financial situation. That's why we provide scholarships to hundreds of deserving participants each year, taking both motivation and merit into account.

OUR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM CONSISTS OF FIVE MAJOR AWARD CATEGORIES:

Leadership Awards

Leadership Awards are merit-based scholarships offered through select schools and youth-serving organizations. These awards were created to provide young students with demonstrated leadership potential the opportunity to attend a 15- or 22-day course in the summer after their sophomore or junior year of high school. Each participating organization determines the criteria by which they select their award recipient.

Memorial Scholarships

Emerging Leader Memorial Scholarships are annual awards created in memory of a loved one who had a life-changing experience with HIOBS. These are cherished awards, and we are honored to be able to offer these meaningful tributes.

Pinnacle Scholars

The Pinnacle Scholars program provides the opportunity for high-achieving students, many from economically disadvantaged

backgrounds, to attend an Outward Bound course free of charge. This program represents a partnership between HIOBS and youth-serving and college-prep organizations across the country.

Veterans Program

The Outward Bound for Veterans program provides fully-funded, weeklong courses for returning service members and veterans of the U.S. military. These courses have been made possible by generous contributions from a network of private donors and charitable foundations that contribute either directly to HIOBS or through Outward Bound, Inc.

School & Community Group Programs

In addition to the scholarships awarded to students attending our classic expedition courses, scholarship donations to HIOBS in 2022 were also used to support our Summer Search program, The Telling Room, Aaron's Presents, and the Martin County Boys & Girls Club program.

Our Veterans Program provides opportunities for them to learn new skills, challenge themselves, and enjoy time working together with other Vets. In addition, thanks to the generous support of corporate and individual donors, we are able to offer our Veterans programs fully funded. This allows us to ensure equitable access to valuable programming and guarantee that Veterans attending our courses do not incur any fees or associated costs for the course, including travel.




PROGRAM REPORT


