DEAR HIOBS COMMUNITY,

As students near the end of their Outward Bound course many lament returning to the real world. While we could debate which world is more real—the one that occurs on an Outward Bound expedition or the one we depart from and journey back to after our expedition is over—for me there is no question. And here's why.

On course we form a culture and community around a group of disparate individuals. We align around a common set of goals and deal head-on with the challenges that differences in background and perspective as well as coping with one's own vulnerabilities and personal exposures can bring. We do all this in a setting that can be uncomfortable at best and debilitating at worst. And we do it through a sense of shared jeopardy.

Shared jeopardy is when you know, deep in your being, that your success or failure is intrinsically linked to those around you. When a group truly embraces

a sense of shared jeopardy they can achieve the seemingly impossible: sailing 30 miles in the fog in one day; making a delicious meal out of three ingredients and one soggy spice kit; laughing with your crewmates in the midst of a soaking rainstorm. All this is Outward Bound.

So here is my challenge to you. Let us commit to connecting the reality we see on an Outward Bound course to the reality of our worlds outside of Outward Bound. Seek common ground, not division. Set lofty goals, not easy ones—collectively and individually. Do the hard work it takes to meet a real challenge or master a skill. When someone is vulnerable or needs help, pick them up and give them strength. And know that no matter how alone we may feel at times, we are all in it together.





Memorial Scholarships


Annual awards created in memory of a loved one. They provide meaningful tributes to our students and families.


