Discovery Awards

Since 1983, these courses have helped Veterans celebrate their achievements, enhance their sense of social connection, and successfully translate their skills into leadership positions in their homes, communities, and places of work — all completely free of charge.

Pinnacle Partners


For these courses, Hurricane Island Outward Bound School partners with youth-development organizations across the country like Summer Search and Boys & Girls Clubs. Together, we help get students ages 14-18 into life-shaping wilderness experiences and prepare them for post-secondary achievement at an absolutely critical time in their lives.

Leadership Awards

Provided at more than 20 public and private schools, these awards give young women and men with demonstrated leadership potential the opportunity to catalyze their skills and ability during a 15- or 22-day course in the summer after their sophomore or junior year of high school.

Created to honor and remember loved ones, these annual awards provide meaningful tributes to our students and families across many of our courses, schools, and geographies.



